Help is Still Available!

Free Disaster Case Management for those still suffering from the impacts of Ida is available through a partnership between NJ Department of Human Services and St. Vincent De Paul Disaster Services. The State of New Jersey launched three new programs for property owners impacted by Hurricane Ida in March of 2023:

- Homeowner Assistance Recovery Program (HARP): This program provides grants to owner-occupied properties to repair, rebuild, and/or elevate their storm-damaged home. The maximum assistance is \$300k for a single family home.
- **Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA):** This program provides supplemental rental assistance for low-income rental families who were impacted by Hurricane Ida for up to 24 months.
- Housing Counseling and Legal Services: Provides supportive services, such as
 foreclosure prevention, relocation services, and debt management, and assists with
 application intake for CDBG-DR-funded programs to help impacted residents transition to
 more permanent housing.

You can apply for any of these services on the State's website.

In April, a \$20 million program for Small Rental Repair (SRRP) is planned to launch, offering zero-interest, forgivable loans to owners of small rental properties (less than 7 units) for repair, rebuilding and/or elevation.
